One Day Watercolour Florals and Botanical Sketchbook Workshop at Port Colborne Art Club - Supply List

We will be working on sketching and painting studies of florals, fruit, and leaves on paper pads or in sketchbooks, from live specimens.

Water	colour paper - between 6 x 8 and 11 x 14 in size.
	I recommend a 140lb hot press (smooth) paper pad where the edges are held in place, like the Fluid Hot Press Finish Watercolour Paper Block 140lb/300gsm
	or the Arches Hot Pressed 140lb Watercolour Block.
	I also often work in and will be showing my botanical sketchbook - if you would like to work in a watercolour sketchbook, any 140lb hot press watercolour sketchbook would be good, it's nice if they can open flat.
Sketch	
	Pencil (or multiple pencils). I prefer a slightly harder pencil (2H or H) for initial
	sketches but sometimes use a softer pencil (2B or softer) for details later on.
	AND/OR a Mechanical Pencil with a 0.3 or 05 lead
	Kneadable Grey Eraser
	Optional: Mechanical Eraser (works like a mechanical pencil, but extends a white eraser instead of pencil - good for erasing in small areas)
	Optional: Black Fineliner (like Micron 01 or 005) for making notes beside sketches (but can also use pencil for this)
Water	colour Paints
	I recommend investing in professional paints if you intend to paint watercolour for a long time, but for those just seeing if they like watercolour, purchase the Winson and Newton Cotman Line.

☐ I personally prefer natural red sable brushes, but I use a variety of brands every day from cheap to expensive, natural to synthetic. For the purposes of this workshop, please bring a variety of sizes of round watercolour brush, including some small (0 or 00) detail brushes (I have these in both rounds and riggers, whatever you can find we will make it work!)		
A container for water		
Paper Towels/rags for cleaning brushes and wiping off excess paint.

Optional: Ruler or divider (I use this divider from Amazon) to help with sketching accuracy, especially if you are new to drawing from live specimens.
